LIGHTWEIGHT MEN'S ROWING AT MIT CAMBRIDGE-MIT EXCHANGE

The Cambridge-MIT Exchange (CME), now in its eighth year, allows Cambridge students in their third year to study at MIT in Cambridge, Massachusetts.

THE ROWING: The Varsity Lightweight Men's Crew is MIT's only Division I sport and competes against the fastest lightweight rowing colleges in the USA. Regular and Post Season races include lightweight competition against: **Harvard, Yale, Princeton, Columbia, Cornell, Dartmouth** and **Pennsylvania.** Team training starts in September and runs through the IRA National Championship in June.

THE STUDY: There are 10 Courses of Study through the exchange including: Biochemistry; Chemical Engineering; Chemistry; Economics; Engineering: Overall (Aeronautics/Astronautics, Civil & Structural, Electrical, Information, Mechanics, Manufacturing); Materials Science; Mathematics; Medicine; Physics; Vets.
